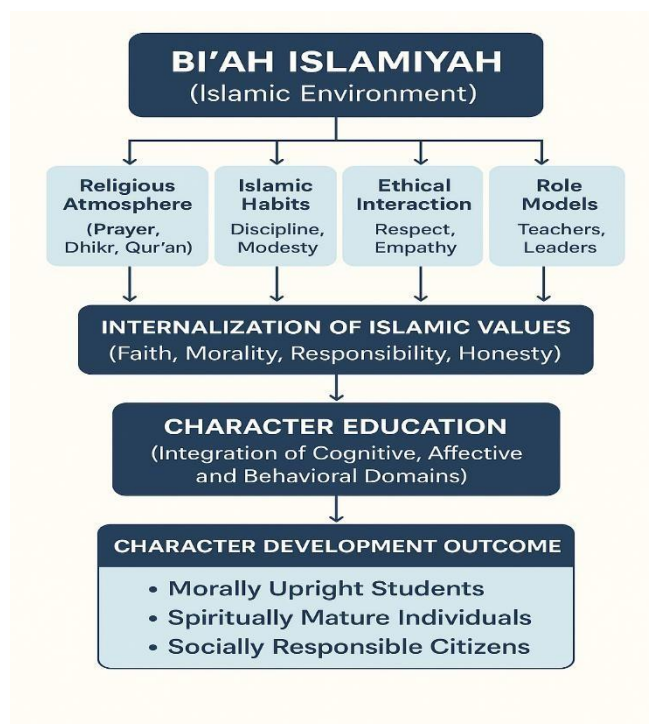
Moreover, how technological adoption in business sustainability creates non-linear patterns that require a deeper understanding of digital disruption.
